Athens International Airport's passengers for the year 2010 amounted to 15.4 million, experiencing an overall decline of 5% compared to 2009. Analytically, domestic passenger traffic, mainly affected by the extremely difficult financial and economic situation in Greece, experienced a decline of 9.4%, amounting to 5.5 million, while the international sector illustrated a more robust performance, registering a small loss of 2.4%, with 9.9 million travellers. The traffic downturn was also driven by a series of unprecedented events, i.e. the international economic crisis, the tremendous upheaval caused to the European air transport sector by natural phenomena and harsh weather conditions, such as the volcanic ash during last April and the heavy snowfalls during December 2010 and last but not least the Greek carriers' consolidation of services.
